



September Produce News

Potatoes - Idaho now harvesting new crop potatoes. Volume and quality look good early. Larger sized baking potatoes continue to fall short of demand. Market should weaken as harvesting continues and storage sheds begin to be filled with new potatoes.

Lettuce - Supplies are ample, shipping from the Salinas California. Quality is good with a steady market price expected for September.

Onions - Market has become steady. Onions shipping from the northwest, primarily Washington and Idaho. Storage onions will begin shipping later this month.

Tomatoes - Homegrown tomatoes are winding down. As growing regions change, the market price may strengthen. Quality should remain good through September.

Grapes - California continues shipping good volume. Quality remains good with stable pricing expected for September.

Strawberries - California strawberry harvest may be down. Should cause the market to rise and quality is always an issue in the fall.

Apples- Most varieties of apples will begin shipping new crop later this month. More varieties will be harvested in greater quantities this year.
